MISSION MOMENT

Battling cancer can be a difficult, painful process, especially for young children.

The Magic Yarn Project brings beautiful homespun superhero and princess wigs to the smallest cancer fighters across the United States. Beanies made of soft yarn are crocheted by volunteers and then transformed into princesses and superheroes by adding long strands of yarn and adornments.



In October 2018, the Camarillo Amber's Light Lions Club in partnership with the Magic Yam Project, Anthem, and the Boys and Girls Club hosted more than 50 volunteers to crochet wigs into Ariel, Elsa, Wonder Woman, Moana, and Rapunzel – just to name a few. In a few hours, volunteers were able to create 60 wigs, which were given to cancer patients and their siblings free of charge.

The Lion's partnership with Magic Yarn Project has become a staple in the pediatric cancer community in and around Los Angeles and the members of the Camarillo Amber's Light Lions Club hope to encourage Lions Clubs around the country to strike up their own partnerships with organizations with similar passions.

SERVICE SPOTLIGHT

MD27 is fortunate to have Wisconsin Lions Foundation (WLF) overseeing statewide projects, most notable of which are the Wisconsin Lions Camp; our eyeglass-recycling center; and hearing aid, vision screening, and diabetes awareness programs. MD27 is also incredibly lucky to be supported by our global foundation, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF).

The power of two foundations working together can't be overstated. MD27 received its first LCIF grant of



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\$30,000 in 1984, to bring Wisconsin Lions Camp's sanitation system up to code. Since then, 85 LCIF grants totaling nearly \$2.4 million have been critical to Lions' ability to make a difference for those who call the Dairy State home.

Here's a glimpse into what collaboration among WLF, LCIF, and Lions have been able to do.

Wisconsin Lions Camp Expansion and Improvement

More than 70,000 campers have experienced fun in the sun while attending Wisconsin Lions Camp, which opened in 1956. Through the decades, the camp has been a mecca for children and adults who are blind and visually impaired; and for children with mild cognitive disabilities, who are deaf or hard of hearing, and for youngsters with diabetes.

Like anything built more than half a century ago, the camp has needed costly repairs over the years. And as campers' needs have changed, so have the camp's. With funding from LCIF supplementing their own financial contributions, Wisconsin Lions and WLF have been able to build four new camp cabins; expand vision screening, eyeglass initiatives; and make important strides in diabetes awareness.



Most notably, a new Health Lodge was added to the camp — a \$75,000 LCIF grant making its construction possible, bringing the camp up to

county code, and facilitating smoother processes for camp registration and medication administration.]

In the Area of Childhood Cancer

Another life-enhancing — or in this case life-saving — initiative made possible by WLF and LCIF is the purchase of flow cytometers critical to treating children stricken with cancer. With the medical equipment's cost beyond what the WLF could shoulder alone, MD27 applied for and received \$200,000 in grants from LCIF, the combined funds from the two foundations serving the ailing children and their families.

Someone once said, "the pie is big enough." We can support our local Lions foundations while also supporting our global foundation, LCIF. Lions clubs and their members have different abilities to give at different times. If we don't have the dollars in our budgets currently, let's get creative and hold a new fundraiser with proceeds dedicated to LCIF!

Without LCIF grants, Wisconsin Lions would not have been able to touch as many lives over the years and carry out our mission of "Reaching, Touching, Improving Lives." If we want to continue helping as many people as possible, we must support our best financial partner, LCIF, with donations to replenish grant dollars awarded here in CA I and around the globe.
